Below, we list a variety of forms and their related statuses which are ineligible. If a student does not provide a document that proves his eligibility for Title IV aid, he is not eligible with these documents alone:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A social security card or driver’s license • Someone who has only a “Notice of Approval to Apply for Permanent Residence (I-171 or I-464). • Employment authorization card • Nonimmigrant visas include those with work visas, students, visitors, and foreign government officials. Nonimmigrant visas include (but are not limited to) the: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. F-1, F-2, or M-1 Student Visa 2. NATO Visas (NATO) 3.
