- Employment authorization card only
- Passport Card that is **one year duration**
- **Nonimmigrant visas** – include those with **work visas, students, visitors, and foreign government officials. Nonimmigrant visas include (but are not limited to):**
 1. F-1, F-2, or M-1 Student Visa – B-1 or B-2 Visitor Visa – J-1 or J-2 Exchange Visitors Visa
 2. A2 and A3 Visas (foreign official, including attendants) – G series Visa (pertaining to international organizations)
 3. H series or L series Visa (allow temporary employment in the U.S.)
 4. NATO Visas

- I-688 for temporary residents under the Legalization or Special Agricultural Worker program
